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#### FROM YOUR BOARD PRESIDENT

Because of the Christmas and New Year holidays our publisher requires that the articles for the December and January issues of the Link be submitted BEFORE our monthly board meetings, so there's only a few items for me to cover in this issue.

First, the repairs to the north seawall of our retention pond have been completed. There was much more concrete required than originally estimated so our cost for the repair will exceed the estimated amount. The repair was a) necessary for the safety and well being of our residents, and b) long overdue so we authorized the contractor to finish the job properly. A long time ago I heard a very wise saying: "If you don't have time (or money) to do the job right the first time when will you have the time (or money) to do it over?" I added 'or money' because it is appropriate for our situation. The south wall will be on the list for repairs in 2023.

The board and management company frequently receive comments and complaints from our residents about what I will refer to as "behavior" and "appearance" issues. Listed below are some excerpts of Casa Loma's Rules and Regulations. Emphasis on certain words and phrases has been added for the purpose of this article. Please review them, think about them, and see if your actions and behaviors may be the source for the comments and complaints that we are receiving.

- General Regulation #1: Because of the relative closeness of the mobile homes; it Is required that you give consideration to your neighbors at all times. Everyone is entitled to his fair share of music, television, social and recreational activities, but please try not to let it interfere with the peace and tranquility of your neighbors. Do not become guilty of disturbing the peace of your community. Failure to follow these rules and repeated offenses could cause a fine, suspension of privilege of use, and/or loss of access card.
- General Regulation #3: Maintenance, washing, minor repairing and upkeep of motor vehicles will be permitted in the driveway or under the

carport. <u>Major motor vehicle repairs in excess</u> of twenty-four (24) consecutive hours will not be <u>permitted</u>.

- General Regulation #4: <u>There will be NO PARKING OF ANY VEHICLE ON THE GRASS by residents in Casa Loma without prior permission of the Board of Directors or Management.</u>
- General Regulation #7: No owner or tenant may allow any rubbish, refuse, garbage, or trash to accumulate in places other than in the garbage or trash receptacles. Each lot and mobile home exterior, including but not limited to lawn, planting beds, landscape, carports and sheds to present a neat and maintained appearance.
- General Regulation #8: <u>It requires at least three</u>
   (3) board members to approve any construction or changes to the lot. Corner lots must be careful not to plant any items that will obstruct the view on the street. Forms are in the hall entrance or can be obtained from the office.

For the first item in the list, there is no call for anyone verbally abusing another resident of the park. It may be a trite saying, but... "If you can't say anything nice, don't say anything at all!" The last item in the list, among other things, covers items like fences, expansion of the parking area (i.e. parking pads, concrete extensions or abutments), the addition of storage sheds, or the replacement of a storage shed larger than the original shed. If you are in doubt – come to the office and inquire before purchasing anything or contracting with anyone to make changes to your lot. Unapproved changes may end up with you to be required to remove those changes at your own expense.

I've also been requested to remind everyone that you should not make plans to use the *Activities Hall* or *Pavilion* without first confirming with the office that those amenities are not already committed. Just because something is not on the calendar at the back of the Link does not mean that someone hasn't already reserved the facility. That calendar is generally prepared in the middle of the previous month.

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#### **FOR YOUR GOOD HEALTH**

December is National Safe Toys and Gifts Month. In recent years, the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) has created a robust toy safety system, by requiring testing by independent, third-party testing laboratories around the world; enforcing stringent lead and phthalates limits for toys; imposing some of the most stringent toy standards in the world; and stopping violant and dangerous toys at the ports and in the marketplace before they reach children's hands. These combined efforts continue to foster the confidence of American families as they prepare to shop for toys this holiday season.

#### Safety Tips to Keep in Mind this Holiday Season

#### **Balloons**

Children can choke or suffocate on deflated or broken balloons. Keep deflated balloons away from children younger than eight years old. Discard broken balloons immediately.

#### Small balls and other toys with small parts

For children younger than age three, avoid toys with small parts, which can cause choking.

#### Scooters and other riding toys

Riding toys, skateboards and in-line skates go fast, and falls could be deadly. Helmets and safety gear should be worn properly at all times and they should be sized to fit.

#### **Magnets**

High-powered magnet sets are dangerous and should be kept away from children. Whether marketed for children or adults, building and play sets with small magnets should also be kept away from small children.

#### Once gifts are open:

Immediately discard plastic wrapping or other toy packaging before the wrapping and packaging become dangerous play things.

Keep toys appropriate for older children away from younger siblings.

Battery charging should be supervised by adults. Chargers and adapters can pose thermal burn hazards to young children. Pay attention to

instructions and warnings on battery chargers. Some chargers lack any mechanism to prevent overcharging.

#### Rum Balls

(makes approx. 3-4 dozen balls) From the kitchen of Janeen Rose

#### Ingredients:

- 6 oz. package of Semi-sweet chocolate square
- 2 Tablespoons of White Corn Syrup
- ½ Cup 151 Proof Rum
- 2-½ cups of crushed Vanilla Wafers (11 oz box)
- ½ Cup Powdered Sugar
- 1 Cup chopped walnuts

#### Instructions:

- Melt chocolate over hot water (double boiler).
- Remove from heat and add syrup and rum.
- Add crushed wafers, powdered sugar and nuts
- Wait ½ hour (to avoid being overly sticky) and form into 1" balls
- · Roll in granulated sugar

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# MISDIRECTED MAIL OR PACKAGES




Christmas is coming, and people will be sending out Christmas Cards and packages more than at other time of the year. Be a Good Neighbor!

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#### TRASH PICKUP GUIDELINES



We've seen residents placing large items of furniture, electronics, and appliances on the curb for pickup. Manatee County has a special procedure for such items as outlined below.

#### Furniture & Household Items:

- Two (2) large items may be placed at the curb with your regular garbage and picked up for free. Please do not exceed two (2) large per collection day.
- BBQ grills without propane tanks, bikes, prepared swing sets, prepared fencing, sinks, bathtubs, toilets, sleeper sofas, box springs and mattresses, mirrors or glass (taped, and six (6) feet or less in length).
- Only two (2) large items per pick-up.

#### White Goods / Appliances:

- White goods are large appliances such as refrigerators, air conditioners, washing machines, dryers, stoves, water heaters and freezers.
- There is a minimal charge for curbside disposal per appliance or item.
- You may also elect to dispose of your item at the landfill for a fee or utilize your one free annual pick up.
- To schedule pick up of white goods, please call the Utilities Customer Service at 941-792-8811.

#### **Televisions:**

**Do NOT dispose of TVs in your trash.** Prior arrangements must be made before placing a TV at the curb.

#### **Disposal Options:**


- Call 941-792-8811 and speak to a customer service representative for details to schedule a special pickup. You may use your one "free annual" option or pay a fee for this service.
- Deliver the TV to the Manatee County Landfill Monday through Saturday from 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m. and between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. on the 3rd Saturday of each month for proper disposal at no charge.
- If you are able to unload your TV without assistance from County personnel, you may bring it to the Lena Road Landfill Monday-Saturday 8:00am-5:00pm. Please stop and speak with scalehouse staff; there will be no charge for disposal.
- Check with your local thrift store to see if they are accepting donations of working TVs.


