FROM YOUR BOARD PRESIDENT

It's so nice to see our seasonal residents returning to the park. I speak for the rest of the board, and the year-round residents, that it's good to have you back. As you will see in the following



pages our Activities Committee has been busy scheduling activities all the way to the end of the year.

The big items of discussion at the October board meeting, as you might expect, revolved around Hurricane Ian and the continued deterioration of the easement around the perimeter of our retention pond.

The Annex building lost some siding, resulting in water getting into the pool/game room and the workshop. The lanyards broke on our flagpoles, and several of the street signs and other signs throughout the park were damaged. Unfortunately, the insurance deductible for this damage is \$30,000, and it's very unlikely that the cost to make the repairs will exceed that so all the repairs will have to come out of our operating account.

As to the residences in the park, a number of them suffered some severe hurricane damage – mostly to their roof. Alot of other properties had what might be considered minor damage – siding damaged or lost, damaged gutters and soffit or fascia. Several mail boxes and trees were also damaged or destroyed. As I drove around the park I was pleased to see how our community came together – neighbors helping neighbors, people cleaning up debris not only on their own properties but also on the properties of our absent seasonal residents. These are just two of the heartwarming activities I witnessed. I'm sure there were many others.

The erosion of the ground around our retention pond has continued. Our early attempts at repairing the damage weren't as successful as we had hoped. We have now reached out to several companies in order to make a more permanent (and costly) repair. By the time you read this the repairs to the north wall of the pond should be completed. The projected cost for this repair is \$8,200 and because it is a

hazardous situation that could affect the safety of our residents the board authorized the expenditure to be taken from our reserve funds.

I'd also like to make an appeal to our residents, especially the seasonal ones, to come to the Board Meeting on November 15th. You'll be glad that you did!

FOR YOUR GOOD HEALTH

November is Epilepsy Month. Epilepsy is a central nervous system (neurological) disorder in which brain activity becomes abnormal, causing seizures or periods of unusual behavior, sensations and sometimes loss of awareness. Anyone can develop epilepsy. It affects both males and females of all races, ethnic backgrounds and ages. Seizure symptoms can vary widely. Some people with epilepsy simply stare blankly for a few seconds while others repeatedly twitch their arms and legs. Having a single seizure doesn't mean you have epilepsy. At least two seizures without a known trigger (unprovoked seizures) that happen at least 24 hours apart are generally required for an epilepsy diagnosis. Treatment with medications or sometimes surgery can control seizures for the majority of people. Some people require lifelong treatment to control seizures, but for others, the seizures eventually go away. Some children with epilepsy may outgrow the condition with age. Signs and symptoms may include:

- Temporary confusion.
- A staring spell.
- Stiff muscles.
- Uncontrollable jerking movements of the arms and legs,
- · Loss of awareness, and
- Psychological symptoms such as fear, anxiety or déjà vu.

A person with epilepsy will tend to have the same type of seizure each time, so the symptoms will be similar from episode to episode. Page 4 Casa Loma

Epilepsy has no identified cause in about half of the people with the condition. In the other half, the condition may be traced to various factors. There also may be a genetic influence depending on the type of seizure or the part of the brain affected.

- Head trauma as a result of a car accident or other traumatic injury.
- Brain tumors and vascular malformations.
- Infections such as meningitis, HIV, and viral encephalitis, and
- Epilepsy can also be associated with developmental disorders such as autism.

With any seizure activity you or a family member has, you should call your doctor. Seek medical help if the seizure lasts more than five minutes; breathing or consciousness doesn't return after the seizure stops; a second seizure follows immediately; you have a high fever; you are pregnant; you have diabetes; you have injured yourself during the seizure or you keep having seizures even though you've been taking seizure medication.

Date Nut Bars

(makes approx. 36 bars)

Ingredients:

- 1 Cup Flour
- 1 Cup Sugar
- 3 Eggs
- 1 Pound Chopped Nuts
- 1 Pound Chopped Dates
- 1 Heaping tsp. Baking Powder
- Powdered sugar for rolling

Instructions:

- Mix flour, baking powder, sugar together.
- Stir in nuts & dates.
- Add beaten eggs & mix well.
- Spread thinly in 13x9 pan.
- Bake at 3750 for 12-15 minutes.
- Cut in squares or bars.
- Cool for 20-30 minutes before rolling in powdered sugar.

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
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FOOD FOR THOUGHT...

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
