FROM YOUR BOARD PRESIDENT

Many changes have taken place in the Casa Loma community this past month and there are more to come.

Newby Management is still actively searching for a new park manager. Several prospects have been interviewed but none have been a fit for our parameters.

We have received a letter of resignation from Kelley Jatich, vacating the Secretary position as of 9/11/2023. Robert Glenn, our "board member at Large", volunteered to move into the vacant position and was voted in unanimously by the board. With this move, the board was left with an even number of members. By state regulations, the board must consist of an odd number of members, so another alternate position was voted on. Karen Yeager was unanimously voted in to fill the position.

We are still reviewing all contracts with every contractor working with Casa Loma to ensure that we are getting the best services and the best possible prices.

We are also in the process of securing our facility by replacing the locks on the pool room, annex building, and clubhouse. I have requested a list of all active key fobs from Newby Management. We will be reviewing the list to ensure that only the authorized personnel have access.

New business discussed at our September 12th meeting included issues with our budget. Due to the fact that we have a deficit in our budget, the board has voted against golf cart repairs, additional cameras and all other cosmetic improvements to the park. We are planning to attempt to reduce the deficit in the budget by having a garage sale to sell off all unused equipment and materials in the annex building. In addition, we discussed renting the clubhouse for events to generate revenue. We will also be scheduling a meeting for the sole purpose of discussing increasing the monthly HOA fees.

We also discussed a community improvement grant offered by the county that matches the funds

that we spend on any community improvement up to \$10,000 match.

THE HISTORY OF HALLOWEEN

Halloween is a holiday celebrated each year on October 31, and Halloween 2023 will occur on Tuesday, October 31. The tradition originated with the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain (pronounced sow-in), when people would light bonfires and wear costumes to ward off ghosts. Samhain was also celebrated to welcome in the harvest and usher in "the dark half of the year. In the eighth century, Pope Gregory III designated November 1 as a time to honor all saints. Soon, All Saints Day incorporated some of the traditions of Samhain. The evening before was known as All Hallows Eve, and later Halloween. Over time, Halloween evolved into a day of activities like trick-or-treating, carving jack-olanterns, festive gatherings, donning costumes and eating treats.

The celebration of Halloween was extremely limited in colonial New England because of the rigid Protestant belief systems there. Halloween was much more common in Maryland and the southern colonies.

As the beliefs and customs of different European ethnic groups and the American Indians meshed, a distinctly American version of Halloween began to emerge. The first celebrations included "play parties," which were public events held to celebrate

the harvest. Neighbors would share stories of the dead, tell each other's fortunes, dance and sing. Colonial Halloween festivities also featured the telling of ghost stories and mischief-making of all kinds. By the middle of the 19th century, annual autumn festivities were common, but Halloween was not yet celebrated everywhere in the country.

Borrowing from European traditions, Americans began to dress up in costumes and go house to house asking for food or money, a practice that eventually became today's "trick-or-treat" tradition. Young women believed that on Halloween they could divine the name or appearance of their future husband by doing tricks with yarn, apple parings or mirrors.

In the late 1800s, there was a move in America to mold Halloween into a holiday more about community and neighborly get-togethers than about ghosts, pranks and witchcraft. At the turn of the century, Halloween parties for both children and adults became the most common way to celebrate the day. Parties focused on games, foods of the season and festive costumes.

Parents were encouraged by newspapers and community leaders to take anything "frightening" or "grotesque" out of Halloween celebrations. Because of these efforts, Halloween lost most of its superstitious and religious overtones by the beginning of the twentieth century.




